

Standard Operating Procedure for Emergent Dialysis Patients (Code Dialysis)

PURPOSE: To establish guidelines for a standard operating procedure for the treatment of patients identified with the need for emergent dialysis. This process will be 24hours/day, 7 days a week.

SCOPE: This policy applies to all patients entering the UAB Hospital (Main Campus) through the Emergency Department (UED).

POLICY:

- A. Patient Inclusion Criteria: to be determined on a case-by-case basis
 - a. Hyperkalemia >6.5
 - b. Hyperkalemia with EKG changes
 - c. Pulmonary edema requiring BiPap
 - d. Uncontrolled hypertension requiring IV drips
 - e. Other clinical indications as deemed necessary, including intoxications or severe metabolic acidosis.
- B. Exclusion Criteria:
 - a. Routine dialysis patients presenting to the UED
 - b. Dialysis patients not meeting criteria above
- C. Goal: To begin all dialysis sessions within 90 minutes of initial call to Nephrology
 - a. Exceptions: Need for new access, ICU bed not available in time
- D. UED Evaluation and medical management:
 - a. Initial patient assessment:
 - i. Complete vital sign assessment
 - ii. EKG
 - iii. Serum studies including chemistry and VBG
 - iv. Chest radiograph (CXR)
 - v. Determine dialysis access type and/or need for placement.
 - b. Medical management and respiratory support.
- E. Identification of patient meeting criteria: INITIATE CODE DIALYSIS
 - a. Notification of Nephrology & ICU Teams, IDU Nurse, ED ANM/Shift Leader, NRC
 - b. Dialysis access **re**assessment.
 - c. Determine location for needed dialysis (ED Bed #31, IDU, ICU)
- F. Nephrology and ICU Teams to assess patient status, medical management, and respiratory support to aid in determining the appropriate location, type of dialysis and disposition of patient.
 - a. ED admit bed request (Center for Patient Flow)
- G. ED ANM/Shift Leader to assess bed availability and facilitate appropriate transfer/transport to designated location (UED#31, ICU, IDU)
 - a. If an ICU bed is needed, escalate to NRC
- H. ED Nurse:
 - a. Notify dialysis nurse of patient status (pager #1966)
 - b. If patient remaining in the ED, give hand-off report to dialysis nurse
 - c. If patient being transported, call report to IDU or ICU nurse
 - d. Transport patient to IDU or ICU
- I. IDU Nurse:
 - a. Prepare and set up dialysis equipment
 - b. Respond to appropriate location (ED, IDU, ICU)
 - c. Initiate dialysis treatment within established timeframe
- J. Any issues should be escalated to the Nephrology Fellow
