
Who should be referred for HIV PEP?

If the client...

- Has multiple assailants
- Is assaulted by a man who has sex with men
- Is assaulted by someone who is an injection drug user
- Is assaulted by someone known to have a positive HIV diagnosis (see below)



^{*}Contact with saliva, urine, sweat, tears, or other bodily fluids <u>not visibly contaminated with blood</u> is considered negligible risk, and does not need referral for HIV PEP.

If any of the criteria above applies to your client, they are considered to have a <u>substantial risk of HIV exposure</u>, and should be referred for HIV post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP).

72-hour limit from time of exposure
