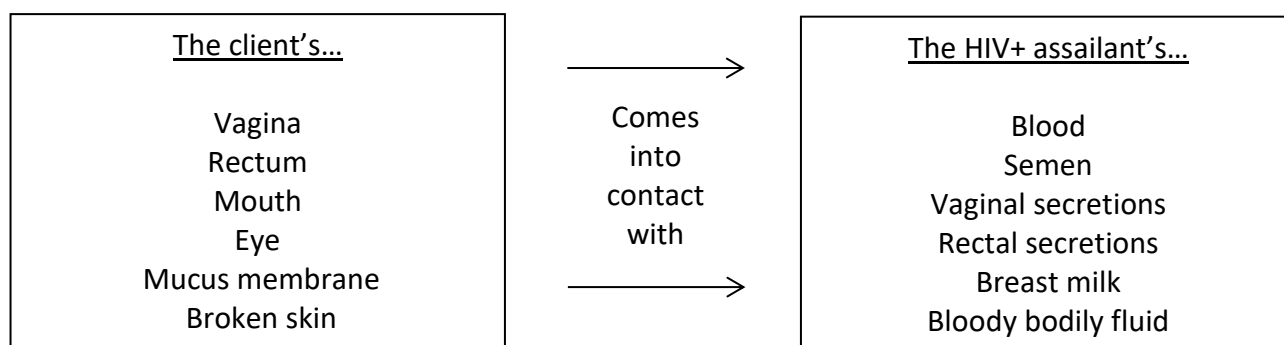


# Who should be referred for HIV PEP?

## If the client...

- Has multiple assailants
- Is assaulted by a man who has sex with men
- Is assaulted by someone who is an injection drug user
- Is assaulted by someone **known to have a positive HIV diagnosis**  
(see below)



\*Contact with saliva, urine, sweat, tears, or other bodily fluids not visibly contaminated with blood is considered negligible risk, and does not need referral for HIV PEP.

If any of the criteria above applies to your client, they are considered to have a substantial risk of HIV exposure, and should be referred for HIV post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP).

\*\*72-hour limit from time of exposure\*\*

If outside of BAO hours, refer client to UAB Emergency Department.  
Call Kellie or Jessica so arrangements can be made with MDs at UAB.

\*NOT qualified for PEP, but still high risk: already diagnosed with an STI; a man who has sex with men; an injection drug user; or someone who exchanges sex for money, drugs, or other goods.  
HIV testing should be encouraged with these clients. This can also be provided through BAO.
